Your NPDES Permit has been processed in accordance with the appropriate state and federal regulations and establishes the requirements necessary for you to comply with state and federal water pollution control laws. Your NPDES permit can be accessed by logging into the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy's (EGLE) MiEnviro Portal website at <https://mienviro.michigan.gov/ncore/>. On the left side of the screen, select your site, then select "Documents." To narrow down the list of documents, type "NPDES permit - FINAL" in the search field in the "Name" column and look for the latest version of your permit.

The issuance of this permit does not authorize the violation of any federal, state, or local laws or regulations, nor does it release you from having to obtain such permits or approvals, including any other EGLE permits, from other units of government as may be required by law.

REVIEW THE PERMIT'S EFFLUENT LIMITS, MONITORING REQUIREMENTS, AND COMPLIANCE SCHEDULES CAREFULLY. These are subject to the criminal and civil enforcement provisions of both state and federal law. Permit violations are audited by EGLE and the United States Environmental Protection Agency and may appear in a published quarterly noncompliance report made available to agencies and the public.

Your monitoring and reporting responsibilities must be complied with in accordance with the permit. Self-monitoring data shall be submitted via EGLE's MiEnviro Portal system. Other reports and notifications shall also be submitted via MiEnviro Portal unless the permit instructs otherwise.

PLEASE NOTE: The Department's permitting/compliance database has undergone a name change from MiWaters to MiEnviro Portal. This name change does not impact any requirements you may have under your NPDES permit regardless of whether the old or new database name is referenced in it or anything associated with it. The database's old internet address (<https://miwaters.deq.state.mi.us>) will continue to function as a redirect to the new address provided above.
